Extending The School Year

Friday, May 17th is currently scheduled to be the final day of school for the 23-24 school year. At this time, we are still evaluating whether it will be necessary to extend the school year due to the loss of instructional time that we experienced in January. I currently expect a final decision to be made about whether or not the school year will need to be extended by mid-March, and then being able to communicate that decision to the public no later than Friday, March 15th.

Construction Update & Proposed Bond Election

As many of our patrons know, a comprehensive facilities project was initiated in late-2021 with a bond campaign to finance additions and renovations of our existing PK-12 facilities and site. Costs for completing the project, however, ultimately exceeded the financing provided by the 2022 bond campaign, and statutory changes in school funding have eliminated some options for funding the project's completion.

Seeing that the facilities project is a needs-driven endeavor, completing the comprehensive facilities project in its entirety remains a goal for the board of education. To finance the completion of the comprehensive facilities project, the board will hold an election seeking voter approval for the issuance of bonds as a means for securing the funds necessary for completing the project. The bond election will coincide with the statewide primary election which will be held on Tuesday, May 14th. Like the bond election that was held in May of 2022, a simple majority of votes cast is required for passage of the bond initiative.

At its regular February board meeting, the board of education passed a resolution to call for the election seeking voter approval for the issuance of general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$6,850,000. The board's resolution was then filed with the election commissioner shortly after its passage by the board.

Over the coming weeks, additional information will be made available on the district's website. Additionally, the board of education will hold a series of special meetings for the purpose of sharing information with the public and answering questions. 




