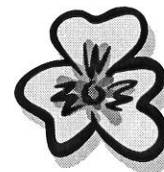

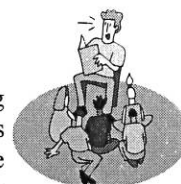


SUMMER READING PROGRAM

There is a wonderful opportunity waiting for you to make a difference in the lives of young readers this summer! "One World, Many Stories" is the theme of the



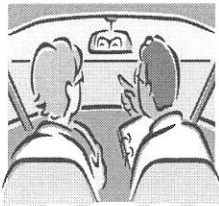

2011 DRIVER'S EDUCATION

Driver Education instruction will again be offered to Heartland students through the Nebraska Safety Council. The instruction will take place at Heartland Community Schools in Henderson. The fee for the instruction will be \$280.00 per student for the summer of 2011. You can go online and download a registration form at www.nesafetycouncil.org. Please send completed form and registration fee to PO Box 30578, Lincoln, NE 68503-0578. Checks should be made out to the Nebraska Safety Council. Students can also pick up a registration form from the school office. The fee must be paid by June 30, 2011, to have a spot reserved for each student.



- **Advanced registration and payment are required.**
- **Students must possess a school learner's permit, a school permit or a learner's permit to enroll.**

Only one session will be offered this summer and will run July 5-July 13. The behind-the-wheel instruction will be arranged during the classroom sessions. If you have any questions, please contact the school office.

ENCOURAGE YOUR CHILD TO READ OVER THE SUMMER

It's important to keep your child reading over the summer. Reading for pleasure helps stem "summer learning loss."

But what if your child doesn't even like to read during the school year, let alone when she doesn't have to? Use summer to try a few strategies to lure her into the world of good books. Consider:

- **Time in the car.** One family relied on movies to keep the children entertained during long car trips. Then one day, the parents decided to experiment with listening to a novel on CD instead. It worked well and now they have listened to dozens of books. Best of all, the listening inspired the kids to pick up the paper versions of the books and read them.
- **Time spent waiting.** Summer is often a time to schedule doctor's appointments and do errands that never seem to get done during the school year. Bring books or magazines along any time your child will be waiting. Choose any reading material that will entertain her.
- **Alternative formats.** If your middle schooler has never tried graphic novels, summer is a great time to try one. These novels have turned many young people onto reading. See if her favorite story comes in graphic form.

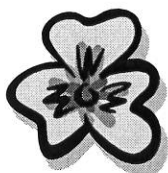


Front Row: Sondra Buller, Allison Braun, Bailey Carr and Ashley Quiring.

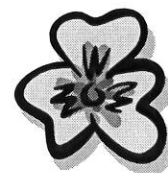

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SPORTS PHYSICALS

A physical examination is required each year prior to participation in any athletic activity sponsored by the Nebraska School Activities Association. The physical examination is valid for one year from the date of exam and may be performed any time after May 1 prior to the next school year. These physicals are for all students entering grades 8-12 who will participate in sports for the 2010-11 school year. Payment of \$25.00 is required at the time of service. You will need to use the school physical form from Heartland as your verification. These are available in the high school office for pick up.

SEVENTH GRADE PHYSICAL

A physical examination is required upon entry into 7th grade according to Nebraska LB59 law. The physical may be performed up to 6 months prior to the beginning of the school year in which your child is enrolled in 7th grade.

The clinic is requesting a parent/guardian to please accompany the student to the exam. If the student plans to participate in sports, the sports physical will be completed at the same time the 7th grade physical is performed.

All 7th grade students are required to have three doses of the Hepatitis B vaccine, two doses of MMR vaccine and the Varicella vaccine or a history of having chicken pox. Immunizations are available at the clinic or at a reduced cost at area immunization clinics.

Once the physical exam and immunizations are completed, the original physical form(s) should be returned to the school. This can be done any time prior to the first day of school. The cost of this physical is \$50.00. Immunizations are not included in this charge.

KINDERGARTEN PHYSICAL

A physical exam is required upon entry to kindergarten according to Nebraska LB59 law. This physical may be performed up to six months prior to the beginning of the school year in which your child is enrolled in kindergarten.

The following immunizations are required upon entrance to kindergarten: 2 doses of MMR, 3 doses of Hepatitis, at least 3 doses of DPT and IPV, and one dose of Varivax (if your child has not had the chicken pox). Please bring your child's immunization records at the time of the physical so we can make sure their immunizations are current. Immunizations are available at the clinic or at area immunization clinics at a reduced cost.

Once the physical exam and immunizations are completed, the original physical form(s) should be returned to the school. This can be done any time prior to the first day of school. The cost of this physical is \$50.00. Immunizations are not included in this charge.

BABYSITTING BUILDS RESPONSIBILITY, GIVES YOUR CHILD WORK EXPERIENCE

Part-time jobs are great for teaching your child responsibility. But middle schoolers aren't quite old enough for gainful employment. Still, there's one job that seems tailor-made for preteens--it's babysitting.

But not every preteen is mature enough to handle babysitting. To decide whether yours is ready to take on the job, ask yourself:

- **Has your child** shown an interest in babysitting?
- **Does she have** experience caring for children? If so, is she patient?
- **Does your child** do well when she's home alone? If she gets jittery the moment you leave, she may be uncomfortable babysitting in a strange house.
- **Is your child** self-sufficient? Can you count on her to take care of an emergency situation?

If you've considered these points and your preteen seems like a natural babysitter, help her find some jobs. It will nurture her sense of responsibility.

The board heard administrative reports on the elementary art show, third grade invention convention, fifth grade showcase of their state research, fourth grade personal research, NeSA testing, the summer library program, *One World, Many Stories*, that will run from June 7 – July 15, ACT Prep for 9 students, FFA and NHS activities, parent teacher conferences, Sophomore field trip to the cranes, Smorgasbord, the Musical, and the staff inservice to prepare for the upcoming school improvement visit from an external team of educators.

Action 7: Motion by Larson, second by Wilhelm, to hire a third high school volleyball coach for the 2011-2012 season. Motion Failed: 3-for; 3-against (Larson-yes, Stuhr-no, Braun-no, Allen-no, Brune-yes, Wilhelm-yes).

Action 8: Motion by Stuhr, second by Larson, to accept the resignation of Ashley Isaac, who was recently appointed to the language arts position. Motion Carried: 6-for; 0-against.

Action 9: Motion by Braun, second by Wilhelm, to go into executive session to review coaching assignments, review support staff pay, student health concerns, and to discuss negotiations at 10:56 p.m. Motion Carried: 6-for; 0-against.

President Brune declared the end of executive session at 12:05 a.m.

XXII Adjournment

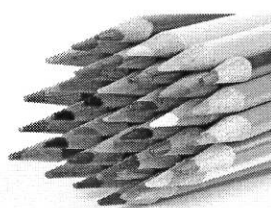

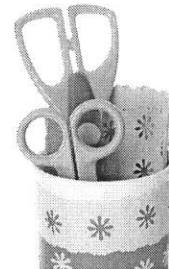
