Over the next few months, the potential will exist for us to have late starts or school closures due to weather or hazardous, travel conditions. Weather-related decisions regarding late starts and school closings will always be made with the highest regard for the safety our students, parents, and staff. Our goal will be to make decisions as early as is reasonable so that we can provide parents, students, and staff with as much advance notice as is possible. If late-start or cancellation decisions cannot be made the night before, our goal regarding early-morning decisions will be to communicate with you between 6:00 AM – 6:30 AM. We ask that you keep the school up to date with your contact information (i.e. current phone number and email address) to ensure that our School Messenger

On November 22nd, the Nebraska Department of Education released statewide assessment and accountability results for the 2022-2023 school year.

Statewide assessments (called NSCAS) are administered to students for English Language Arts (ELA), Math, and Science. Students in grades 3 through 8, and 11, are assessed in the areas of both ELA and Math. The Science assessment is administered to students in grades 5, 8, and 11.

Overall performance on these assessments is categorized as either 'Developing', 'On Track', or 'Advanced'. Often times we will informally use the term 'Proficient' to refer to performance that is categorized as either 'On Track' or 'Advanced'.

Results from the NSCAS assessments are helpful to schools as they monitor and evaluate the performance and progress of their systemic programming (i.e. curricula, instructional methods, student support systems, etc.). Statewide assessment results are valued, but they are only one piece of the portfolio of information that we would use to evaluate the educational effectiveness of our school. Local and classroom information along with nationally standardized assessment information are also important pieces of information that we'll use to create a comprehensive picture of how our students and our school perform academically.

Heartland students have historically performed quite well on a variety of performance measures including the statewide assessment and accountability system (NSCAS). Heartland students continued to support this trend with strong performance on the statewide assessments during the 22-23 school year.

Each year, schools in Nebraska are given a rating of either **Excellent**, **Great**, **Good**, or **Needs Support** as a part of Nebraska's system for meeting federal accountability requirements. An overall rating of either **Excellent** or **Great** is quite positive, and Heartland Community Schools received an overall rating of **Excellent** for the 22-23 school year.

As tempting as it may be, statewide NSCAS results are not intended to be used, nor should they be used, for the purpose of comparing individual school districts against each other. The statewide assessments are on-size fits-all assessments often taken on one day. The results are useful as a general indicator of progress and performance across the board, and they can be useful as a guide to decision-making inside of individual school districts, but as a measure of comparing different school districts against each other, their usefulness is questionable – especially when only looking at a single year of performance.

The performance of Heartland Community Schools and its students does compare favorably against statewide performance. The included table illustrates Heartland's performance in comparison to the performance of all schools/students across the state. For context, we will also look at our performance compared to schools that are either our size or in our geographical area; we will do this to add greater understanding to our results, not to create competitive comparisons between school districts. Heartland students continue to compare quite favorably with students in all schools across the state, with students in schools that are similar to our district in size, as well as students in schools that are located in our geographic area.

We will always monitor our performance and our progress, and we will always look to improve our systems and practices in areas where improvement is needed. We can, however, be proud of the levels of learning and performance of our students here at Heartland Community Schools. We can also be proud of the people and the systems that we rely upon to help our students to learn and to perform at high levels.




K - 6th Christmas Concert December 7th

Heartland Quiz Bowl & Math Competition

The fall semester of Heartland quiz bowl and mathematics bowl competitions was busy and very successful. The quiz bowl team competed in four tournaments and the mathematics team competed in one.

The first tournament was a literature based competition held in Seward. We had two teams competing and the team of Ben Janzen, Austin Schmidt, Adi Duerksen and Kate Franz came home with the runner-up trophy. The next competition was for the young women on our team. Two teams competed with the team of Mia Hiebner, Adi Duerksen, Kate Franz and Tara Buzek finishing in the top four. We then attended the history/geography focused competition held at Concordia University. Two teams competed and the team of Nick Thieszen, Jamisen Klein, Austin Schmidt and Adi Duerksen were awarded the runner-up trophy. The final quiz bowl competition of the semester was held in Central City and consisted of questions in all areas. In the previous competitions, schools were divided into divisions with other schools the same size. Central City was one large tournament. We had three teams compete and two of the teams found themselves in the top 16 bracket. At the end of the day, the team made of Ben Janzen, Nick Thieszen, Jamisen Klein and Austin Schmidt found themselves competing for the championship against the team from Seward. It was a great game and once again, Heartland came home as the runner-up team. The 2nd best team out of 45 teams of all sizes is pretty impressive.

The lone mathematics competition was held in Lexington and was the first Mu Alpha Theta mathematics competition to be held in the state of Nebraska. There were a variety of individual competitions and one team competition. Mia Hiebner came away with the silver medal for the middle level math students. Mrs. Buzek came home with the gold medal and Mrs. Ruhl came home with the silver medal in the teacher division. Not all of the mathematics team members were able to attend due to the National FFA convention.

Thank you to the Heartland National Honor Society for facilitating the program.



HEARTLAND FFA COMPETES AT STATE LAND JUDGING

Land Judging is a high school competition that challenges students to gain a better understanding of soil structure and land evaluation. Teams consist of four students from the same FFA chapter, and a few individuals who qualified separate from a team. Each participant learns how to recognize the physical features of the soil, determine land capability for crop production, and evaluate management practices needed for proper stewardship. During the competition, students judge four soil pits using an evaluation card to make assessments on: soil depth, surface texture, permeability, slope, thickness of surface and erosion. The evaluation card is scored to determine overall placements for individuals and the team. To compete in the state contest, teams advance from one of the seven regional competitions hosted across the state in October.

Heartland FFA placed 8th overall. Zach Miller placed 29th, David Hiebner placed 55th, Jace Friesen placed 70th, and Cash Parrish received 77th.

Ten Heartland FFA members recently attended the National FFA Convention in Indianapolis, IN. The students departed on October 31, riding a charter bus with other chapters from McCool Junction, Bruning-Davenport, Palmyra, Freeman, and Falls City.



Not only did members attend the National Convention, they also went on agricultural industry tours. On Tuesday, October 31, students took two industry tours. The first was at Shatto Milk Company in Osborne, Missouri. Here they learned about the milking and processing part of the dairy industry. Members were able to sample some of Shatto's dairy products which included seven different milks, two creamers, two butters, and four flavors of cheese curds, and sampled a scoop of ice cream. All products were made and produced at Shatto Milk Company.

The second tour of the day was at Battlefield Lavender located in Centralia, MO. This farm has diversified from just growing 16 varieties of lavender to also growing loofahs, and raising bees and chickens. Heartland members were taken into their drying barn where they have lavender hanging in bundles for consumers to buy to use as aromatherapy or for culinary purposes.

On Wednesday, the group toured Hummert International in Earth City, MO. Hummert is a greenhouse supplier and has a show room that can be visited so that potential customers can see what types of greenhouses are available.

They then traveled to Perryville, MO, where they first stopped at Stonie's Sausage Shop to learn about processing and smoking meats.

Their next stop was at the American Tractor Museum where they were able to stroll through the museum looking at antique tractors and had the opportunity to visit with Arley Berkbuegler, the mechanic for most of the tractors.

The last stop for the day took them to the Missouri National Veterans Memorial where they had learned about the Vietnam conflict and saw the sister wall to the monument located in Washington D.C.

On Thursday, members attended the opening session of National FFA Convention where they heard messages from Joe Hogsett, the Mayor of Indianapolis, Tom Vilsak, United States Department of Agriculture Secretary, and Juan Bendana, motivational speaker. Following opening session, members attended the Career Expo, attended workshops, and made friends from other states.



On Friday, members took four tours before ending the day at a rodeo. The first tour of the day was to Tuttle Orchards. Students learned more about apple production and processing. They also sampled five varieties of apples and were able to sample their homemade apple cider. The next tour was to Abbott's Candies where members learned more about the history of the company, how to make caramels, and watched the process of covering the caramels with chocolate. Donkeys were on the next agenda. Members were able to pet the donkeys and take selfies with them. The last tour was at Four Leaf Honey farm. This facility was once a horse veterinary facility, but after a change in careers, the vet decided he wanted to continue on with the bee farm that his grandfather started.

Heartland FFA members returned home on Saturday, November 4. This trip is always one that students look forward to, and it helps to educate them about various aspects of agriculture and our world that they might not otherwise have the opportunity to learn about.





Heartland FFA members competed in District Livestock Judging at the Merrick County Fairgrounds in Central City. Thirty-three members were split into either the Senior Division or Junior Division.

The Senior Division was comprised of high school seniors and juniors. Eleven Heartland members competed in this division. In the Junior Division, made up of high school sophomores and freshmen, Heartland had 22 members compete.

Livestock judging consists of various livestock classes where members have to select the correct order of animals. Competitors also have to give oral reasons for why they placed the classes the way they did. Classes that competitors judged were market hogs, breeding ewes, market lambs, breeding does, market goats, breeding bulls, market steers, and a keep or cull class of heifers.

After the classes were placed, the Junior Division gave one set of oral reasons on market steers. The Senior Division gave two sets of oral reasons on market steers and breeding ewes.

Heartland's Senior Team placed 11th. The Junior Heartland Team placed 3rd, earning the right to compete at state. State will be held in April during the State FFA Convention.
