Why are we pursuing recommendations for updates and expansion of our building from the facility study?

The following are just some of the reasons for consideration:

Front Entrance

- Building security is centrally located and visibility of front doors is restricted
- Visitors gain direct access to the building unless met at the door
- Exterior needs structural upgrades due to age
- First impressions to visitors and community

Classrooms

- Educational strategies have changed to focus on targeted instruction in small groups
- Pre-school age students are turned away due to the lack of space and staffing
- Henderson and Bradshaw are discussing expanded housing opportunities
- Positive trend of alumni and other young families moving to our district

Locker Rooms & Weight Room

- No major updates for nearly 40 years, resulting in safety and ADA access concerns
- Need more room to enhance training facilities for student athletes
- Utilize old locker rooms for visiting teams to eliminate athletes passing through cafeteria
- Serves as a sense of pride, morale, and visitor impression to have quality training and locker room facilities

Activity Entrance & Connecting Corridor

- Security and weather concerns with students passing outdoors between shop and main building
- Dedicated entry and concessions area for indoor activities
- Room to display the history of Heartland and the communities of Henderson and Bradshaw

Costs

For all of the above projects, the cost would be about \$5.17 million. Interest rates are low and will likely rise in the near future

- For a 20-year bond at current interest rates, this would add 5.25 cents on the levy or \$2.75 per month per \$100,000 of residential property @ 75% valuation
- Agricultural land, at 50% valuation, would translate to about \$26 per year or \$2.17 per per month per \$100,000 valuation



DISTRICT LIVESTOCK JUDGING

On November 3rd, 37 of the Heartland FFA chapter members got to experience what it's like to judge livestock at the Merrick County Fairgrounds in Central City for District Livestock Judging. They judged breeding ewes, market lambs, breeding does, market goats, breeding gilts, breeding bulls, market steers, and keep or cull heifers. They also answered questions regarding the animals and gave reasons on why they placed the animals the way they did. The animals that junior judges gave reasons on the market steer class. The senior judges gave reasons on was the market steer class and the market goat class. The four highest scores created a team. The Heartland FFA Junior district livestock team score was Zach Miller (placed 19), Cheyenne Danielson (placed 40), Madison Mason (placed 69), and Carter Siebert (placed 93). The team placed 12th. The Heartland Senior livestock team scores were David Onnen (placed 64), Emilie Albrectsen (placed 68), Wyatt Panko (placed 73), and Kambel Newman (placed 76). The team placed 10th.


