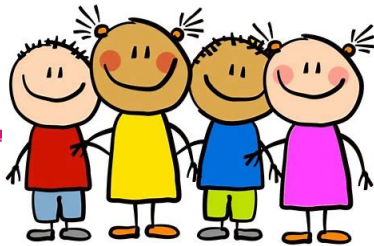


Breakfast/Lunch Prices for 2022-2023

The USDA waiver for free school meals has expired. Prices for the 2022-2023 school year are as follows:

Breakfast prices are \$1.95 for students and \$2.00 for adults. Students who qualify for the reduced price meals will pay \$0.30. The milk price is \$0.45. Lunch prices for students in grades K-6 are \$3.10, 7-12 lunch \$3.25, employee lunch \$3.80, guest lunch \$4.00. This amount is entered on your child's lunch account every week.

***We ask that all families keep their lunch accounts with a positive balance.**



It is the policy of Heartland Community Schools, in accordance with Nebraska law, that special education records be destroyed five years after they are no longer needed to provide educational services to a student.

If your child was dismissed from special education five or more years ago, his/her special education records will be destroyed. A permanent record of name, address, phone number, grades, attendance record, classes attended, grade level completed and year completed will be maintained at the school.

If you would like a copy of your child's records, please contact the school at 402-723-4434. If we do not receive a request from you, your child's records will be destroyed beginning September 15, 2023.

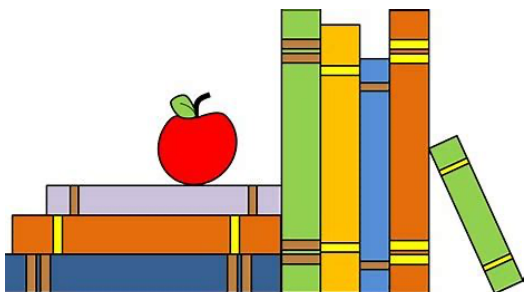
