

FFA STATE CONVENTION

The Heartland FFA had a successful turn out as they took on State FFA Convention in Lincoln, Nebraska. The chapter had 20 students compete in at least one contest at State, with 4 people being in the State Honor Choir, and 6 members who earned their State FFA degree. 228 kids from around Nebraska competed in the Ag Mechanics contest. The Heartland team placed 30th out of 57 teams. The team consisted of Ben Janzen (42nd and a blue ribbon), Andrew Franz (111th and a white ribbon), Jordan Nolan (134), and Jacob Buller (212). This contest consisted of a team activity (which the team placed 6th overall in), hydraulic/Pneumatic Test and Practicum, Electrical Wiring, Electricity, Operations manual, and a theme machinery practicum.

It wasn't a shock when the Heartland FFA chapter made state for food science this year. Out of 36 teams the Heartland team fought hard to place 13th. Leading the Heartland team was Maddie Maltsberger (66th and a white ribbon), followed by Grace Regier (110th), Ruby Kliewer (116th), and Allie Boehr (123rd). At this contest they placed second in the team portion of the activity but unfortunately could not carry the knowledge over to the individual aspects of the contest.

Not only did Heartland have upperclassmen compete they also had a Junior Livestock Judging team. These students woke up at the crack of dawn to participate in their contest. They placed 52nd out of 56 teams. The members on this team include Kaleb Ostrander (18 and a purple ribbon), Katrina Epp (161st), Zach Miller (196), and Adilynn Duerksen (217).

Grace Regier also competed in the Senior Public Speaking event, where she received a bronze ranking. She also received third place for her proficiency in the Small Animal Care and Management Supervised Agriculture Experience; for her work as a kennel assistant at York Animal Care.

Four members were selected to the State FFA Honor Choir: Marisol Stamp, Grace Regier, Ben Janzen, Zachariah Quiring. During each general session, these members performed a series of songs and performed the National Anthem. Six senior members received their State FFA degree. This is the highest degree that the state can bestow upon a member. These members were: Madelyn Maltsberger, Merrick Maltsberger, Cole Miller, Wyatt Panko, Zachariah Quiring, and Grace Regier.

The Heartland FFA chapter was awarded a Gold Rating in the National Chapter Award Program. This award is based on the chapter's work on the Program of Activities (POA) over the past year. There are three areas in the POA: Growing Leaders, Building Communities, and Strengthening Agriculture. The Chapter's application will move on to the National level, where they will find out the results of their placing at the National FFA Convention in October.












