WELCOME

I'd like to take the opportunity to welcome everyone back for the coming 24-25 school year. As a reminder, the first day of school will be Thursday, August 15th – there will be an early dismissal at 11:40 AM on that first day of school.

Heartland Community Schools is an outstanding place to learn, to grow, and to excel. We have an amazing staff of professionals, we have terrific students, and we have extraordinary support from our parents and our communities. The 24-25 school year promises to be an exciting year full of opportunity and rewarding challenges for our students and for our school-community.

PROJECT INFORMATION

An item of particular interest this year will be the completion of work on our facilities project. Successful bond elections, both this past May and in May 2022, will fund a comprehensive facilities project that includes a number of additions and renovations to our buildings and site.

In late-June, the board of education approved a contract with Hausmann Construction to serve as the general contractor for our project. We're excited to have a quality partner like Hausmann Construction working with us on our facilities project. Completion of the project will likely happen in stages, and we expect to reach substantial completion of our project somewhere between August and October of next year.

In early-July we began the pre-construction phase of our project – this phase involves a variety of meetings, site inspections, and coordination for the purpose of determining logistics, scheduling, and site planning. Our comprehensive project has an element of complexity to it since it touches every corner of our current building/site and because it involves work both inside and outside of our current building. While our project is being completed, our primary goal will be ensuring the safety of our students, staff, and visitors. We'll also work to limit any disruptions to our operations and as well as any inconvenience that might be experienced by our students, staff, parents, and community members.

Our teams are continuing to meet now and will continue to meet through the completion of the process. Our teams include school personnel, personnel from our architectural team, and personnel from our contractor's team. We have not yet determined at what point active work zones will be established or if there will be any noticeable changes when school starts on August 15th. Our goal is to communicate with students, staff, parents, and the community in advance about the initiation of any work zones and what procedural changes will accompany the establishment of various work zones – basic procedural changes that are likely to occur might include alterations to parking procedures, pick up / drop off procedures, as well as procedures for accessing or entering the building. At this point, no procedural changes have been made as they relate to our facilities project. We will, however, provide updates and information about progress towards our project, information about safety and logistics, and information about any procedural changes through our website and social media.
