The first day of school for the 25-26 school year is Thursday, August 14 th – the first day of school will be a shortened day with an early dismissal at 11:40 AM.

Summer Entrance & Office Calendar

Construction on the main entrance and office area has been able to begin now the school year is over. As a result of this construction work, the main entrance on the south side of the building will be closed for the summer months. Office personnel have also been relocated for the summer as well.

The building entrance that will be used for the summer months is Entrance #23 which is located on the west side of the building. This is the same entrance that was used to enter the building for home games during this year's basketball season.

Office personnel have been relocated to the high school library for the summer months. The high school library can be easily found by entering the building through Entrance #23 and walking straight down the hallway. The high school library will be on your left as you walk down the hallway.

Construction Update

Construction in the elementary classroom addition, in the locker room / weight room addition, and in the daycare / early childhood building should reach substantial completion by mid-July. Construction in the north gym and in the expanded Activities Entrance should reach substantial completion by August 1 st . Construction in the main entry / office area should reach substantial completion prior to the start of school in August.

Although not entirely completed, the weight room will be available for use by student athletes this summer, starting June 2nd . Neither the Activities Entrance nor the north gym will not be available for use throughout the summer as work in those areas is currently scheduled to conclude on August 1st .

Although a date has not yet been set, an open house / viewing event for the public is tentativelyplanned for early-August.

SPECIAL EDUCATION RECORDS

It is the policy of Heartland Community Schools, in accordance with the Nebraska law, that special education records be destroyed five years after they are no longer needed to provide educational services to a student.

If your child was dismissed from special education five or more years ago, his/her special education records will be destroyed. A permanent record of name, address, phone number, grades, attendance record, classes attended, grade level completed and year completed will be maintained at the school.



HEARTLAND AT STATE QUIZ BOWL

he Heartland Quiz Bowl Team traveled to North Shore Church in Hastings to participate in the 2025 Nebraska State Quiz Bowl Tournament. They earned this honor by winning the small school division at the ESU #6 competition in March. Thirty teams from across the state of Nebraska, representing the 15 Educational Service Units in the state were in attendance. The morning began with an assembly of everyone in attendance to review the rules for the competition. ESU #2 in Hastings hosts many quiz bowl competitions and did an excellent job of making sure the rules were clear and followed diligently.



The tournament consisted of a randomly generated double elimination bracket with a total of 58 matches to be played. Four rooms were used during each round and Heartland was able to watch a round before they were scheduled to compete. The first round for the Huskies was a match up against the team representing Southern Valley. After a somewhat slow start, Heartland settled down and beat the Eagles by a score of 85-50.

The next match was against the team from Lyons-Decatur Northeast. It was a low-scoring match and going into the last question, the score was tied 35 to 35. Unfortunately, the Cougars buzzed in first and won the match 40-35. The third match of the day pitted Heartland against the team from Meridian. This too was a low-scoring game with the

The final match of the day for Heartland was against the team from O'Neill. The Huskies were never able to get going in the round and lost 75-15.

The tournament was won by the team from Elkhorn North, followed by Elkhorn High, and Central City. Central City is a team that Heartland is familiar with, having lost to them at the Central City Invite before defeating them at the Nebraska Christian Tournament. The quiz bowl team has had a tremendous season, and the community should be very proud of them. The final tournament is designed as a sneak peek at the next school year by not allowing seniors to compete. This contest is scheduled for May 7 in Seward.

UNDERCLASSMEN QUIZ BOWL

The Heartland quiz bowl team traveled to Seward on Wednesday, May 7th to attend the "Underclassmen" tournament held at Living Word Lutheran Church. The morning started with a round robin tournament in which both of the Heartland teams finished with a 2-1 record. After lunch, the twenty teams in the small school division were placed in a single-elimination tournament where the A team was seeded 5th and the B team was seeded 10th.

Both of the Heartland teams faced tough competition in their first round and the A team lost their match against the team from BDS by one question 105-115. The B team faced the A team from Friend for a rematch of their first match of the day and ended up falling during the second meeting. Both teams ended the tournament with a 2-2 record.

The team looks forward to a great year in 2025-2026.




