From Brad Best, Superintendent...

To our parents and supporters,

There has been a lot of discussion across the state and in the legislature surrounding how property taxes are out of control and that they must be reduced. Many people believe that the schools continually increase their tax asking every year and that we should reduce our budgets to provide this relief. Over the last 10 years, the state has provided less funding for schools and pushed the responsibility back on the local property owners. The first year for Heartland (98-99), the district received \$576,000 in state aid. This last year, we received \$8,400. From \$3.7 million in state equalization seven years ago, York has dropped to just \$225,000. To fund the state budget, we need a tax system that is fair and balanced for all Nebraska taxpayers in every school district. Between 70-80% of a school's budget is to pay for items mandated by our same state legislature. We have no control over those expenses. What we have is not a school spending issue; it is a state funding issue.

In the Heartland district, we have reduced our tax asking each of the last 3 years. Because this trend will not last forever, we need to motivate our state senators to come up with a solution. We are closely monitoring the current bills being discussed in Lincoln. I encourage you to make your voice heard with our local representatives and encourage them to step up and deliver the funding that they have taken away over the last 10 years in order to relieve property owners. They need to find a way while allowing local control of expenditures.

Here are some statistics that you may find interesting:

- Nebraska ranks 49th in the country in the percentage of K-12 funding that comes from the state.
- Nebraska property owners pay the 7th highest effective property tax rate in the nation.
- Nebraska K-12 schools receive 33% of their funding from state sources while the national average is 47%.
- Nebraska K-12 schools receive 49% of their funding from local property taxes while the national average is 29%.

PowerSchool- Get the APP!

Many of you access grades through PowerSchool, but if you don't have the app, the app is a little more user friendly than through the computer. Parents and students can both use the app. One advantage is you don't have to log in every time. Simply open the app to view the account of your student(s). A second advantage; you will receive a notification with an up to date grade each time a teacher adds an assignment. Everything you check from the computer, you can check on the app. You will need to know the school's access code: GGXN. Then, log in with the username and password you created for PowerSchool on the web (if you haven't done this, you will need to). See Tim Carr if you have additional questions or need help.

Heartland Preschool Taking Applications for 2017-18 School Year

Heartland Preschool is now taking applications for the 2017-18 school year, which will begin August 16, 2017. There will again be two sessions, each running four days a week, Monday through Thursday. Mornings will be for 3-yearolds and the afternoons will be for 4 & 5-year-olds. Children can attend two, three, or four sessions a week. The current cost for students to attend preschool is \$65.00 per month for 2 sessions a week; \$97.50 per month for 3 sessions a week; \$130.00 per month for 4 sessions a week. A cost increase may go into effect for the 2017-18 school year, pending approval by the Heartland School Board. Tuition can be paid by the month, quarter or semester, and is due prior to the start of each pay period. Reduced or free tuition is also available for those families who qualify. Please let the school office know if you want to apply for tuition assistance. Children who are verified for special education services attend at the cost of the district, with no charge for the parents. Their schedule is determined by their Individual Education Plan (IEP).

Interested parents can pick up an application form at the Heartland School office and then return the form after completing it.
