

Breakfast/Lunch Prices for 2020-2021

Lunch prices have been set for the 2020-21 school year. Lunch prices for students in grades K-6 are \$2.80, 7-12 lunch \$2.95, employee lunch \$3.80, guest lunch \$4.00. Students who qualify for reduced price meals will pay \$0.40. Breakfast prices are \$1.75 for students and \$2.00 for adults. Students who qualify for the reduced price meals will pay \$0.30. The milk price is \$0.40. Kindergarten students will have their afternoon milk charges included in their lunch accounts. This amount is entered on your child's lunch account every two weeks. We ask that all families keep their lunch accounts with a positive balance.



Physicals & Immunizations

All students entering grades 7 & 9 that would like to participate in athletics need to have a sports physical for 2020 - 2021.



Students entering grades 8, 10,11, or 12: If they have a sports physical on file at the school for 2019-2020, they do NOT need a new one. If your child is participating in sports in grades 8-12, their athletic physicals <u>must be completed and turned into the office</u> before they can participate.

All Kindergarten and 7th grade physicals must be completed before school starts. Physicals can be scheduled at Henderson Health Care between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. Payment is required at the time of service and unless a parent accompanies, a written or verbal consent must be provided.
