Breakfast/Lunch Prices for 2020-2021

Lunch prices have been set for the 2020-21 school year. Lunch prices for students in grades K-6 are \$2.80, 7-12 lunch \$2.95, employee lunch \$3.80, guest lunch \$4.00. Students who qualify for reduced price meals will pay \$0.40. Breakfast prices are \$1.75 for students and \$2.00 for adults. Students who qualify for the reduced price meals will pay \$0.30. The milk price is \$0.40. Kindergarten students will have their afternoon milk charges included in their lunch accounts. This amount is entered on your child's lunch account every two weeks.

We ask that all families keep their lunch accounts with a positive balance.



Physicals & Immunizations

All students entering grades 7 & 9 that would like to participate in athletics need to have a sports physical for 2020 - 2021.



Students entering grades 8, 10,11, or 12: If they have a sports physical on file at the school for 2019-2020, they do NOT need a new one. If your child is participating in sports in grades 8-12, their athletic physicals must be completed and turned into the office before they can participate.

All Kindergarten and 7th grade physicals must be completed before school starts. Physicals can be scheduled at Henderson Health Care between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. Payment is required at the time of service and unless a parent accompanies, a written or verbal consent must be provided.

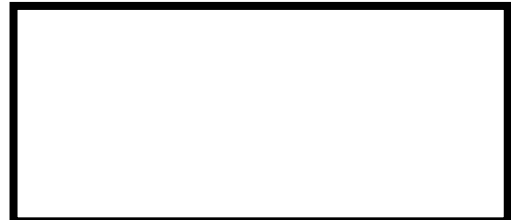
**ANNUAL NOTICE TO PARENTS:
Right to Request Teacher Qualifications**

Our district receives federal funds for Title 1 programs. You have the right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of your child's classroom teacher(s). If you request this information, the district or school will provide you with the following as soon as possible:

- If the teacher has met state licensing requirements for the grade level and subject in which the teacher is providing instructions;
- If the teacher is teaching under an emergency status for which state licensing requirements have been waived;
- The type of college degree major the teacher has and the field of discipline for any graduate degree or certificate; and
- If your child is receiving Title 1 services from paraprofessionals and, if so, his/her qualifications. If you would like to request this information, please contact your child's school.

Federal legislation requires that schools release the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of all students in grades 9-12 to any military and/or college recruiters that request them. Parents have the right to request that this information not be released without their permission. All parents of students in grades 9-12 will receive a letter with a waiver form attached.
