### It's Time for ..... Girls on the Run!

The Girls on the Run (GOTR) program is a positive youth development program for girls in grades 3-5 which combines training for a 5K run with an interactive curriculum to develop self-respect and healthy lifestyles in pre-teen girls. Our curriculum addresses many aspects of girls' development – their physical, emotional, mental, and social well-being. Lessons provide girls with the tools to make positive decisions and to avoid risky adolescent behaviors.

Girls participating in the GOTR program will meet twice a week, after school, for twelve weeks and will be coached by local volunteer coaches. The season will start the week of February 22nd and continue through May with the culmination activity being a 5K held in York on Saturday, May 7th. The Heartland team will meet after school on Tuesdays and Thursdays.


