SPORTS PHYSICALS

A physical examination is required each year prior participation in any athletic activity sponsored by the Nebraska School Activities Association. The physical examination is valid for one year from the date of the exam and may be performed any time after May 1 prior to the next school year. These physicals are for all students entering grades 7-12 who will participate in sports for the 2014-15 school year. Payment of \$25.00 is required at the time of service. You will need to use the school physical form from Heartland as your verification.

SEVENTH GRADE PHYSICAL

A physical examination is required upon entry into 7th grade according to Nebraska LB59 law. The physical may be performed <u>up to 6 months prior</u> to the beginning of the school year in which your child is enrolled in 7th grade.

The clinic is requesting a parent/guardian to please accompany the student to the exam. If the student plans to participate in sports, the sports physical will be completed at the same time the 7th grade physical is performed.

All 7th grade students are required to have three doses of the Hepatitis B vaccine, two doses of MMR vaccine and two doses of the Varicella vaccine or a history of having chicken pox. Immunizations are available at the clinic or for a reduced cost at area immunization clinics.

Once the physical exam and immunizations are completed, the original physical form(s) should be returned to the school. This can be done any time prior to the first day of school. The cost of this physical is \$50.00. Immunizations are not included in this charge.

KINDERGARTEN PHYSICAL

A physical exam is required upon entry to kindergarten according to Nebraska LB59 law. This physical may be performed up to six months prior to the beginning of the school year in which your child is enrolled in kindergarten.

The following immunizations are required upon entrance to kindergarten: two doses of MMR, 3 doses of Hepatitis, at least 3 doses of DPT and IPV, and two doses of the Varicella vaccine (if your child has not had the chicken pox). Please bring your child's immunization records at the time of the physical so we can make sure their immunizations are current. Immunizations are available at the clinic or at area immunization clinics for a reduced cost.

Once the physical exam and immunizations are completed, the original physical form(s) should be returned to the school. This can be done any time prior to the first day of school. The cost of this physical is \$75.00. Immunizations are not included in this charge.

Physicals can be scheduled at Henderson Health Care between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Payment is required at the time of service.

Heartland Track Teams Place High At District Track Meet

The Heartland girl's and boy's track teams finished 2nd and 3rd, respectively, at the district track meet held at Friend High School. The girl's team finished with 77 points to edge out Friend with 76 points. BDS won the girl's title, amassing 113 points. The boy's team finished a close third by scoring 82 points. First place went to McCool Junction with 86.5 points and second went to Exeter-Milligan with 85.5 points.

Heartland qualified in 7 individual events and one relay for the state track meet in Omaha. Three individuals qualified in the pole vault by clearing the minimum height of 13' for the boys and 9' 3" for the girls. **Ben Driewer** cleared 13' to finish in 3rd place. **Tierney Casper** cleared 9' 11" to finish 3rd, while **Bailey Carr** vaulted 9' 3" to finish in 4th place. Others qualifying in field events included **Keshawn Camacho** winning the shot put with a toss of 44' 3.25", and **Jordan Heinrichs** finishing first in the long jump with a leap of 20' 10".

On the track **Leah Friesen** qualified in the 1600 with a personal best time of 5:50.0. **Austin Stuhr** notched a 2nd place in the 100 meter dash with a time of 11.5. The foursome of **Cole Nickels, Keshawn Camacho, Jordan Heinrichs,** and **Austin Stuhr** posted a time of 46.0 to win the 400 meter relay. Head track coach Larry Vancura was pleased with the performances of both track squads. Coach Vancura stated, "The future looks bright for both the boy's and girl's track teams. We have a lot of underclassman returning and the Jr. High girl's and boy's teams finished in first and second place at the conference track meet to end their season. I would like to thank the Sr. girls for their contributions the last 4 years. All of my assistants would agree that we had a great group of athletes to work with who practiced hard every day. Just about every athlete recorded personal bests in their events this season."
