

From Brad Best, Superintendent... To our parents and supporters,

It saddens me to hear about evil attacks on innocent people, especially in the school setting. While we have implemented measures with electronic door locks to help keep our students more safe, I wanted to update you on additional measures that have been taken or will be introduced in the near future.


The state has recommended a Standard Response Protocol (SRP) that they hope all schools will implement in order to have a common language across the state. Our committee, which includes law enforcement and first responder representation in addition to staff from the school, has been trained in this protocol and have, in turn, trained our teaching staff. Support staff and students will be trained in the very near future and we will be providing much more information to parents over the next few weeks.

The basis of the protocol is how to keep people safe in 4 general scenarios:

- The threat is outside the building (Lock Out)
- The threat is inside the building (Lock Down)
- We need to leave the building (Evacuate)
- We need a safe place due to weather or environmental threat (Shelter)

When one of these horrific instances take place, as parents, we tend to want to come to the school and find or remove our child. While completely understandable, this is one of the biggest concerns that schools, law enforcement, and first responders have in these situations. We all have one thing on our minds during these emergencies and that is to keep your children safe. The congestion of people flooding the school makes the response <u>much</u> more difficult. In the case of a "Lock Down", reunification of kids and parents may be up to two hours later to ensure that all are accounted for and released to proper guardians. We would communicate updates and instructions as often as possible in these situations via our alert system.

We will let you know when we will have an informational meeting for parents regarding our protocols. I hope to have all of this complete within the next few weeks. In the meantime, remember that our teaching staff is trained and we ask for your trust during this strange time in society.

Ch.I.L.D. Day Provided by Heartland Community School

Heartland Community School is setting aside a special time for parents of children age 5 and under to participate in **Ch.I.L.D. Day**, which stands for <u>Childhood Information on Language and Development</u>. Just as parents take their young children to the doctor for medical check-ups, the school can provide to parents the services of a "developmental wellness visit". The early childhood personnel at the school can provide current and useful information to parents concerning the early development of their baby, toddler, or preschooler.

Ch.I.L.D. Day is a childfind effort conducted by the Heartland Community School District. School districts are required to conduct childfind activities to ensure that young children who need early intervention services are identified. Involvement in Ch.I.L.D. Day is a free, completely voluntary service and is conducted in a confidential manner.

Ch.I.L.D. Day is set for **Friday, March 16th, 2018 from 8:00am – 4:00pm**. We will again be meeting in family homes for babies and toddlers so that the children will feel more comfortable in their natural environment. Children ages 3-5 will meet in the Heartland Preschool Room. Interested parents who live in the Heartland School District can call the school office to register for a 45-minute time slot when the early intervention specialists can see their child. Parents will be able to ask questions about their child's development, complete a developmental checklist, and have their child play and interact informally with adults knowledgeable about young children. Further information may need to be gathered at a later time if the parents and school staff see any concerns. Parental permission is required for any further evaluation.

Heartland Community Schools wishes to extend this invitation as one way of providing support and information to parents of young children in our district. Again, parents of young children in the Heartland school district are invited to call the school at 402-723-4434 to register for Ch.I.L.D. Day
