# From Brad Best, Superintendent... To our parents and supporters,

We appreciate your feedback on the parent surveys that were complete as part of our accreditation review. The information provided from you, students, and staff is invaluable to our assessment of school improvement initiatives. There will be a team of 5 educators, who have been trained in the school improvement model we are using, in our district on March 15<sup>th</sup> & 16<sup>th</sup> to scour through stacks of data and evidence of how we are implementing change. The information that we present to this team will be available for all to view via our website once the visit is completed.

The 2016-17 calendar has been approved by the school board and is included in this newsletter. The format is a bit different this year. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to give us a call.

This last Saturday, I witnessed our robotics team compete at a statewide event in Ashland and then later that evening, watched many of our high school students perform at the Winter Song Festival here at school. The day reminded me to reflect back on the year and how involved and successful our students are with school activities and in the classroom. Hundreds of hours are invested by students and sponsors, whether it is in music, athletics, drama, academic teams, business, art, industrial arts, agriculture, etc. that it is mind boggling how they keep it all under control. **Ninety-seven percent** of our high school students are involved in an activity! Most of those are in several groups and many are in more than one activity at the same time of year. In my career, which has encompassed a number of school districts, kids were involved, but never at this level of success in all areas.

At the end of the evening on Saturday, my wife and I had a conversation about our hope "that the communities of Henderson and Bradshaw understand how very fortunate they are" when it comes to the consistency and overall quality of student activities here at Heartland. We have seen some great activities in other districts and we have also seen some that were seriously struggling. No district has the top programs in the state in all areas. But, what we have is a wide-reaching set of quality activities for students of all interests and we are fortunate to have commitment and overall success that is truly in a league of its own. I invite you to reflect on the year, as well, and take a prideful look back with an understanding of how fortunate we are here at Heartland. Thank you for your continued support and tell the kids "thank you" for their hard work in making Heartland a great place to learn!

# **Option Enrollment**

Heartland Community Schools is open to accepting more option enrollment students and we feel that we have much to offer! A student from another district may enroll at Heartland when approved through the option enrollment program.

# Ch.I.L.D. Day Provided by Heartland Community School

Heartland Community School is setting aside a special time for parents of children age 5 and below to participate in **Ch.I.L.D. Day**, which stands for <u>Childhood Information on Language and Development</u>. Just as parents take their young children to the doctor for medical check-ups, the school can provide to parents the services of a "developmental wellness visit". The early childhood personnel at the school can provide current and useful information to parents concerning the early development of their baby, toddler, or preschooler.

Ch.I.L.D. Day is a childfind effort conducted by the Heartland Community School District. School districts are required to conduct childfind activities to ensure that young children who need early intervention services are identified. Involvement in Ch.I.L.D. Day is a free, completely voluntary service and is conducted in a confidential manner.

Ch.I.L.D. Day is set for **Friday, April 15th, 2016 from 8:00am – 4:00pm**. We will again be meeting in family homes for babies and toddlers so that the children will feel more comfortable in their natural environment. Children ages 3-5 will meet in the Heartland Preschool Room. Interested parents who live in the Heartland School District can call the school office to register for a 45-minute time slot when the early intervention specialists can see their child. Parents will be able to ask questions about their child's development, complete a developmental checklist, and have their child play and interact informally with adults knowledgeable about young children. Further information may need to be gathered at a later time if the parents and school staff see any concerns. Parental permission is required for any further evaluation.

Heartland Community Schools wishes to extend this invitation as one way of providing support and information to parents of young children in our district. Again, parents of young children in the Heartland school district are invited to call the school at 402-723-4434 to register for Ch.I.L.D. Day


The 5k is open to males and females of all ages. Walkers are welcome! Registration opens on March 10th and the deadline for a guaranteed T-shirt is April 7th.
