To our parents and supporters of Heartland Community Schools,

Fall is officially upon us and school is in full swing! It has been a great start to a new year and we appreciate the support that you have given us in making sure that your children are here and ready to learn each day.

This last month, the board of education approved the budget for the 2012-13 school year. Our adjusted total budget for this next school year shows an increase of less than ½ of 1%. The state legislature has put some severe limits on public school spending, regardless of how frugal some districts have been in the past. On occasion, I get asked about adding new programs and spending more on building improvements. "After all", they say, "We certainly have room in our tax levy to raise the money". That is true - our general fund levy for next year is projected to be at a little over 87 cents per \$100 valuation, which is down over 4 cents from the 2011-2012 school year and 18 cents below the levy limit. One of the reasons for the decrease is a nearly 12% increase in property valuation. The other reason is that we are under the spending limit set by the legislature. Even if we could leave the tax levy as it was the year prior and capture and additional \$160,000, we could not spend it due to these spending rules.

Rest assured that we are doing just fine financially and are looking at ways to enhance programming and building improvements within these spending limits. Our number one priority is to provide a quality education to our children and I believe that we are in a great position to continue that effort. We appreciate your support and take our fiscal responsibility to you very seriously.

Speaking of quality education, our students and teachers performed extremely well on last spring's state tests in reading, math, and science! When one compares the percentage of our students that were proficient on these tests to the state average, our

proficiency level was 13% higher in reading, 17% higher in math, and 27% higher in science. To celebrate this achievement, we held an "academic pep rally" one morning in the theatre and the principals and I served ice cream sundaes to all of the students after lunch the following day. I am not sure how many times I have been asked to have ice cream again ...

Have a great fall and please plan to participate in our school activities and parent/teacher conferences on October 18th and 25th. Stop in for a cup of coffee and a visit at any time.

SCHOOL CLOSING INFORMATION

As the winter approaches, occasional bad weather necessitates the closing of school for the safety of our students. School closing information will be announced over the radio station KAWL (1370) and television stations KHAS, KLKN, NTV and KOLN. In Henderson it will be announced with voiceover capabilities on any cable channel (in town) when your TV is on. We have implemented an automated phone message service through School Reach which we will use for school closings as well. You may also call our school closing phone line at 402-723-4421. If a decision has been made the night before, the closing will be announced at 10:00PM. In the mornings it will be announced on the half hour from 6:30 to 8:00AM (cable only).

Three things middle school teachers want parents to know

It's still early in the school year. You may not have had an opportunity to meet your child's teachers yet. Until you do, consider these three things the teachers probably want you to know:

- 1. Please be involved. Teachers can't force your child to do her homework or to study for tests. Many students are self-motivated and do it all on their own. But many others are not! If yours is one of the latter, set study hours. Oversee your child's work; however, never do the work for her
- 2. Please emphasize to your child how important it is to turn in work. Work that is never turned in may earn a zero. Just one zero can bring down a grade an entire letter—all for something that could have been avoided.
- 3. Please make sure your child comes to school unless she is sick or it's an emergency. Chronic absences will hurt her even more than that zero will.



NEW LUNCH GUIDELINES

Many schools are hearing comments regarding the federal lunch guideline changes for this year. To help combat childhood obesity, first lady Michelle Obama has worked to implement limits on the amount of protein, carbohydrates, fat, sugar, and sodium in school lunches as well as total calories offered to students. These changes have resulted in not being able to offer ketchup every day (sodium), to cut desserts on most days (calories), and to offer only non-fried foods (fat and carbohydrates). The new guidelines that are now in effect also require that a student has a fruit or vegetable on their tray, that all milk is either low or non-fat, and whole grains are used in breading, crusts, or breads.

To deal with these new requirements, students have noticed that meals look different in terms of quantity and include "more healthy options". Our kitchen staff does a great job to prepare quality meals within these tightened guidelines and now offer a fruit and salad bar from which students can take as much as they will eat.

To address the reduced amount of protein, especially for those students that are growing, in activities, or "don't get enough to eat", as long as their lunch balances are up to date, students may purchase an additional entree for 75 cents.
