ACT

The ACT test is a standardized assessment designed to indicate general readiness for first-year, post-secondary course work in areas such as English Composition, Algebra, Social Studies, and Biology. The test traditionally has four sub-tests (English, Reading, Math, and Science), with each sub-test having a maximum scale-score of 36. A composite score (roughly the average of the sub-test scores) also has a maximum score of 36. In recent years an optional Writing sub-test has been added to the ACT test. Historically, post-secondary institutions have relied upon ACT scores as a part of their admissions process as a means of contextualizing academic records for students from their local schools as local districts across the nation may vary widely in a variety of factors. In recent years, the reliance upon measures such as ACT scores by post-secondary institutions in their admissions processes has begun to vary widely by institutions across the nation. Currently in Nebraska, virtually all students will take the ACT test in the Spring of their 11th grade year as a part of Nebraska's statewide assessment requirements. Many students in Nebraska, including students at Heartland, will take the ACT test multiple times, both before or after their participation in the statewide assessment.

For purposes related to the 11th Grade, statewide ACT, the Nebraska Department of Education has established benchmark scores in line with what it has determined for meeting Nebraska's College & Career Readiness Benchmarks. Information related to meeting these specific benchmarks can be found in this report on the previous pages containing NSCAS performance information.

The information on this page includes information related to average performance and the percentage of students meeting the readiness benchmark scores that are determined by ACT. The ACT information titled, "11th Grade Statewide ACT" includes only performance of students on the statewide ACT taken in the Spring of the 11th Grade year. The ACT information titled, "Graduates" accounts for students taking the ACT multiple times prior to their graduation.

ACT has long established its own benchmarks for the ACT test, these are different than the benchmarks that are set by the Nebraska Department of Education. The ACT benchmarks are designed to indicate a 50% probability of being able to perform A-level work in the first year of college and a 75% probability of performing B-level work or higher in the first year of college in each sub-test area. The ACT benchmark scores are as follows: English - 18; Reading - 22; Math - 22; Science - 23.

Class of 2022

The 24th Commencement Ceremony for Heartland High School was held on Sunday, May 8, 2022. The Class of 2022 consisted of twenty-eight graduates. 2022 Co-Valedictorians: Aaron Goertzen & Dawson Ohrt

Class of 2034

The Heartland Class of 2034 began its K-12 journey as 20 students experienced their first day of Kindergarten on Thursday, August 12, 2021.

National Competition

Fifteen students qualified to compete in the 2022 FBLA National Leadership Conference. The 2022 National Leadership Conference was held in Chicago, Illinois from June 28 - July 3, 2022. Freshman student, Austin Schmidt, was a Top-10 National Finisher earning 7th place in the Introduction to Business Concepts event.

Marching Band

The Heartland Marching Band was crowned Champion of the 2021 Yorkfest Marching Competition held in York. The Heartland Marching Band was also crowned Champions of both the Class C division and the Class C and D combined division at the 2021 Harvest of Harmony Field Competition in Grand Island.

Post-Season Athletics

The Heartland Huskies Football Team was crowned District Champions and qualified for the Class D-1 State Playoffs - the team finished their season with a record of 6-3. The Heartland Boys Basketball Team finished their season with a 15-9 record and as the District C2-4 Runners-Up. The Heartland Boys Golf Team qualified for the Class C State Golf Tournament held in Columbus by finishing in 3rd place at their District Meet - the Boys Golf Team would go on to finish the State Tournament with a 13th place finish.

Successful Bond Election

During the statewide primary election held on Tuesday, May 10, 2022, Heartland patrons voted on, and passed, two bond issue questions for financing the costs of both renovations to existing facilities and construction of additional facilities at Heartland Community Schools.

The first question on the ballot was for the issuance of bonds not to exceed a total amount of \$5,690,000 - this question passed by a vote of 531 - 320 (62.4% - 37.6%). Funds from this bond issuance are intended to finance the cost of security upgrades to the main entrance of the school, add four classrooms to the elementary school, connect the Vo-Ag shop to the main building, add a new locker room / weight room addition, and make improvements to the north gym including the installation of AC and the replacement of bleachers.

The second question on the ballot was for the issuance of bonds not to exceed a total amount of \$1,370,000 - this question passed by a vote of 516 - 330 (61.0% - 39.0%). Funds from this bond issuance are intended to finance the cost of constructing a daycare / PK facility adjacent to the existing elementary building.

The district utilized the services of architects, Clark & Enersen Partners (Lincoln/Omaha), and investment bankers, Piper Sandler (Lincoln/Omaha), both prior to and after the bond election. The district closed on the sale of the Bonds in June, 2022 and began to formalize the necessary architectural and engineering plans in the Summer of 2022. At the time of election, it was hoped that the upcoming construction project would achieve substantial completion by August 1, 2024.
